

WHO ARE WE? Choir Descriptions

Mixed Choir is a full-year curricular choral group that meets during the school day (D block). It is a foundational ensemble of mixed voices (soprano, alto, tenor, and bass) that performs a wide variety of choral music, including classical, world music, American folk songs, spirituals, musical theater, popular music, and works by contemporary composers. Particular emphasis is placed on improving students' music literacy, sight-singing ability, vocal production, and ensemble skills. Prior experience singing in a choir is beneficial, but not necessary. Mixed Choir performs at major concerts and school events, including Winter Songfest, ArtsFest, and Spring into Song.

Select Choir is a full-year curricular choral group that meets during the school day (D block). As the name implies, Select Choir is an auditioned ensemble of accomplished choral musicians that performs advanced SATB divisi music. Members also perform musical theater and popular music as part of two small ensembles: Fermata Nowhere and the Crescendudes. As a member, you will be expected to demonstrate a strong work ethic and independence. Select Choir performs frequently during the school year, including major concerts, school events, caroling, fundraisers, and festivals.

RMHS Singers is an extracurricular choral group that meets after school on Wednesday evenings. It is open to all students, regardless of singing ability or prior experience. It is an ensemble of mixed voices (soprano, alto, tenor, and bass) that performs music in a wide variety of styles, from Renaissance to American folk to Broadway. You may choose to participate for first semester, second semester, or both. RMHS Singers performs at Winter Songfest and Spring Into Song.

Harmonium is the new extracurricular a cappella group at RMHS. It meets after school on Thursday afternoons. It is an auditioned ensemble of 11 voices (soprano, alto, tenor, bass, and percussion) that performs a cappella arrangements of popular music from all eras. Due to the nature of the group, members must have strong music reading skills, a confident, engaging stage presence, and excellent intonation (pitch accuracy). Harmonium performs at major concerts and community events throughout the year. To be eligible, you must be a member of Mixed Choir, Select Choir, or RMHS Singers.

WHY SING?

Enduring Understandings

All human beings carry with them an incredible musical instrument: their singing voice. It takes up no space, it requires no parts, and it costs nothing to maintain. Even if you don't become a professional musician, you will use your singing voice throughout your life—"Happy Birthday" at parties, the National Anthem at sporting events, hymns at religious services, folk songs around the camp fire,

lullabies to children... the list goes on and on. Human beings have been using their voices to sing since the beginning of civilization. In fact, it is believed that our ancestors sang before they developed spoken language. There is no human culture, no matter how remote or isolated, that does not sing. Thus, music is an essential element of the historical and cultural record of humankind.

Choir Objectives

- To sing notated choral music at first sight using solfege syllables
- To sing as a blended choral ensemble with precise intonation, unified vowels, and balance
- To sing musically with understanding, interpretation, and expression
- To perform music from varied time periods and cultures with fidelity and accuracy
- To foster volunerability and authenticity in ourselves and others
- To build community through intentional engagement, collaborative problem solving, and resolutely leaning into compassion and empathy

WHAT WILL WE BE LEARNING?

Core Concepts and Standards

Music Literacy

- Identify and use note names, rhythmic values, and music symbols
- Understand key signatures and time signatures
- Follow a choral score with four or more parts

Aural Skills/Sight-Singing

- Sing major, natural minor, harmonic minor, and melodic minor scales
- Correctly use Kodaly hand signals as a physical placement for vocal pitch
- Read music in the keys of C, F, and G (moveable DO) and meters of 4/4, 3/4, 2/4, and 6/8
- Sight-sing stepwise motion and major triads within an octave range
- Aurally identify the major and perfect intervals within an octave range
- Count sing a variety of common rhythms, including sixteenth notes

Vocal Production

- Exhibit proper body alignment while standing and sitting
- Breath using the diaphragm (sing "on the breath")
- Develop a forward, clear tone within the appropriate range
- Demonstrate uniform vowel formation using appropriate mouth shapes for specific vowels
- Practice accurate diction for clarity and understanding
- Sing in multiple world languages using the international phonetic alphabet

Musicianship and Ensemble Skills

- Sing expressively, projecting emotion with the voice and face
- Maintain balance and blending witin a section
- Sing independently as one of four or more voice parts
- Consistently look at and follow the conductor's gestures
- Use choral tools such as written breath marks, catch breaths, and and stagger breathing

Performance Practice

- Develop an awareness of body energy and inward focus
- Practice ensemble decorum while in the performance venue
- Demonstrate appropriate concert etiquette as an audience member



Grading

Mixed Choir and Select Choir members will receive a letter grade based on the following four areas:

- Concerts: 100 points per evening concert
- Rehearsals: 50 points per quarter for meeting daily rehearsal expectations
- Part Checks: 25 points for individual part checks uploaded to Google Classroom
- Assignments: 5 to 15 points each for concert reflections and other occasional assignments

WHAT ARE THE EXPECTATIONS?

Rehearsals

- Be seated with your music and a pencil when rehearsal begins
- Maintain your music and folder with care—these items belong to the school and must be returned at the end of the year
- Store your cell phone where it will not distract you during rehearsal
- Demonstrate an open mind toward varied rehearsal strategies and repertoire
- Refrain from speaking when Ms. Wentlent is working

Note: The extracurricular groups (RMHS Singers and Harmonium) have limited rehearsal time, which makes attendance extremely important. Members must be firm in their commitment and accountable to fellow choir members. If you cannot attend a rehearsal, notify Ms. Wentlent at least one hour prior to the rehearsal. If you miss three or more rehearsals, you may be asked to leave the group.

Performances

September, October, November, and December dates are fairly set, while spring dates are tentative due to the pandemic. We will operate one season at a time!

Concert Attire

Each choir has a specific uniform or dress code, as follows:

- Mixed Choir: Corelli concert gown or tuxedo—purchases/rentals currently on hold until regular in-person performances are permitted
- Select Choir: Jayden concert dress or black dress shirt and pants—purchases/rentals currently on hold until regular in-person performances are permitted
- RMHS Singers:
 - Dress clothes in red, pink, white, gray, or black
 - Black stockings or socks (no white socks) and black dress shoes
- Harmonium: To be determined based on group membership
